The Lay Leadership Committee would like to offer everyone a chance to help on the various committees in our church. Below are the committees and the responsibilities that they have in the life of our church. *You do not have to be a member of the committee to use the special talents you have to help out.* If you are interested in helping any of these committees, please put a check by that committee and place this sheet in the offering plate or the slot in the office door.

TRUSTEE COMMITTEE

The Trustees supervise and maintain all property (church building, outside property, parsonage) belonging to the congregation so that the ministries of the congregation can be effective.

CHURCH COUNCIL

The primary task of the Church Council is to lead the congregation in long-range planning and in carrying out its program so that people are received into its fellowship, encouraged in strengthening their relationship with God, and supported as they seek to live as Christian disciples. The Church Council deals with the administrative concerns of the church.

STAFF-PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE (SPRC)

The Staff-Parish Relations Committee works as a team within the congregation to interpret the local church's mission and vision with several constituencies. The individuals and groups this committee works with include: the pastor, all ordained leaders—both elders and deacons—appointed by the bishop, the lay staff, the congregation (individually and corporately), the community outside the walls of your church, the District Superintendent, and the United Methodist connectional church.

COMMITTEE ON LAY LEADERSHIP

The primary task of the Committee on Lay Leadership is to ensure that the congregation has a process for discovering, inviting, nominating, and supporting people for Christian spiritual leadership positions essential to the ministries of nurture and outreach in your local congregation and community.

LAY MEMBER OF ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The primary task of the Lay Member of Annual Conference is to link the congregation and the connectional church by participating responsibly in Annual Conference sessions and interpreting its actions to the congregation.

N.O.W COMMITTEE

The N.O.W. Committee is a combination of the Witness and Nurture committees. It gives attention to developing and strengthening evangelistic efforts of sharing of personal and congregational stories of Christian experience, faith, and service; communications; lay speaking ministries; other means that give expressions of witness for Jesus Christ; education; worship; Christian formation; membership care; and small groups. Attention must be given to the needs of individuals and families of all ages.

Responsibilities: Prayer Chain, Bulletin Ministry, Eucharistic Ministry, Acolytes, Altar Guild, Communion, Flowers, Liturgical Dance, Music Ministry, Greeters, Ushers, Tape Ministry Team, Family Ministry, Youth Ministry, Camp Steward, Christian Education, Elevator, Nursery, VBS, Safe Sanctuaries

OUTREACH COMMITTEE

The Outreach Committee shall give attention to local and larger community ministries of compassion, justice, and advocacy. These ministries include church and society, global ministry, higher education and campus ministry, health and welfare, Christian unity and inter-religious concerns, religion and race, and the status and role of women.

Responsibilities: Public Relations, Food Bank, Good Samaritans (provide funeral dinners for members and their families), Emergency Health Services, Mission Support (Angel Tree, Operation Reindeer, Easter, Thanksgiving, Christmas food baskets for those in need, 8th Avenue Place, Project Happy Feet, Bethany House, Salvation Army Bell Ringers, Imagine No Malaria, Care packages to college students, Care packages to servicemen, Halloween in a Box (Blackburn Center), Pop Can Tab Collection for seeing-eye dogs, Monthly Love Gifts)
