To date we have 30 pledges which, when paid, will total \$4,190.00.

CONTRIBUTIONS: The Finance Committee has weekly counters who process your contribution envelopes. They open the envelopes, remove the cash/check, and then write the amount enclosed on the outside of the envelope. When the Financial Secretary receives the envelopes she only sees the total amount written by the counters, and any designation selected by the donor. She does not see the cash or checks with memo notes. The checks and money have already gone to the bank. <u>Any special designations wanted for your contribution and the amount you are designating need to be written on the outside of your envelope.</u> <u>All funds go into the General Fund unless there is a special designation marked on the front of the envelope.</u>

The \$2 Fund should appear on the next packet of envelopes and that will help clear up some designations. <u>Until</u> <u>then, you must write \$2 Fund and the amount of your donation on</u> <u>your envelope.</u>

Money from Altar flowers, holiday flowers, and fundraisers should always be a separate check from your regular giving. They may placed in the offering plate.

Just a reminder: the envelope company will occasionally put the envelope for the 1st Sunday of the month in with the previous month's packet. Then again include the 1st Sunday envelope in the new packet. They do this in case there is a time delay in getting out the new set of envelopes. Do not feel obligated to fill both envelopes with the same date.
