CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY

This week we celebrate Christ the King Sunday. This is considered the last week in the Christian year. "Instituted during in 1925 by Pope Pius XI, *Christ the King Day* is a holiday which falls on the final Sunday of the Liturgical Calendar. Although it was originally a Roman Catholic Holiday – known as the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe – it has since been adopted by other Christian denominations as well. The purpose of this holiday is to acknowledge Jesus Christ as the "King of all kings" and it was originally intended as a way to bring God back into a secular world." Pope Pius XI said "If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. <u>He must reign in our minds</u>, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. <u>He must reign in our wills</u>, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. <u>He must reign in our hearts</u>, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. <u>He must reign in our bodies and in our members</u> which
