CHILDREN'S COLLECTIONS: This week our children's collection will be sent to the Connellsville Area Community Ministries (www.connmin.org) to be used to assist with the Connellsville area flooding victims. Following is an excerpt from an article provided by the Volunteers In Mission (VIM.):

State of Emergency in Connellsville District: Many of you are already aware of a storm on Sunday that brought flash flooding and damages in Connellsville and Bullskin Township in Fayette County on August 28th. A state of Emergency was declared, schools closed, and boil water warnings were issued for many in the vicinity. Cleanup of major debris and mud continues in some areas and some roads remain closed.

Local officials and response organizations met to coordinate efforts to help with feeding, sheltering, cleanup and recovery in the areas affected. Several WPAUMC leaders including Rev. Calvin Cook (WPA Disaster Response Coordinator), Rev. Bill Blair (Connellsville District Superintendent), Rev. Bev Spore (Connellsville District Disaster Response Coordinator) and Chip Rowan (Connellsville Area Community Ministries) were part of those meetings.

Initial assessments and damage reporting process was started by the Red Cross, emergency personnel, and others. It is anticipated that many families will be in need of assistance to return their homes to livable conditions due to lack of flood insurance. Wesley UMC in Connellsville will be the hub of the WPA Disaster Response.



Existing Early Response Teams are on alert and will begin their work in the next few days. Additional volunteers will be needed in the coming days and weeks.

Please pray for the safety and peace of those who are devastated by this unexpected and traumatic event in their lives. Pray for the first responders working long hours and those guiding the response.

The last two weeks our Children's Collection raised \$344.00 in donations to be sent to the Eastbrook Mission Barn to help with Cleaning Buckets. Cleaning buckets are available to residents through Connellsville Area Community Ministries (CACM) or the Salvation Army. The Eastbrook Mission Barn will replenish Cleaning Buckets as needed.

Please do not send any other physical donations of household items directly to Connellsville. Connellsville Area Community Ministries already has an abundance of items ready to offer and does not need any more at this time. When and if this situation changes, we will share specific calls for donations.

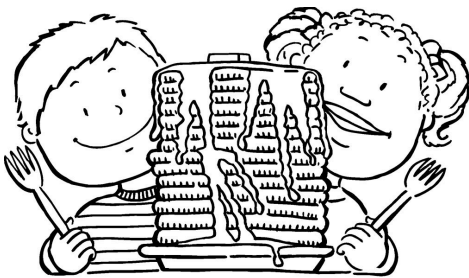
FROM THE NURTURE COMMITTEE

Volunteers In Mission (VIM): United Methodist Volunteers In Mission (UMVIM) is a grassroots movement within The United Methodist Church designed to provide an official channel whereby Christians, both lay and clergy, can offer their skills and talents for Christian service locally, regionally, and around the world for short term outreach projects or purposes.

The UMVIM network offers guidance, organization, training, and support for more than 125,000 volunteers serving others by

- ministries with the poor
- supporting Bible study, Bible School for children,
- building churches
- assisting in disaster response
- community health and medical missions
- community or school repairs
- education and leadership development
- ministries of witness and evangelism

Most volunteers serve at their own expense although many engage in fundraising efforts supported by local congregations. Volunteers serve with a team (typically 5-16 persons) or as an individual. Volunteers need to be in relatively good health, complete an application form, be willing to pay his/her own way or help to raise team funds, and agree to attend team sessions conducted by the team leader prior to departure.

The UMVIM movement began in 1976 and is organized by jurisdiction. Global Ministries networks with the jurisdictional UMVIM offices, which in turn coordinate with annual conference offices. Check out opportunities where you could volunteer to serve!

If you're interested in getting trained to be a VIM volunteer, early Response Team trainings will be held this fall at the following dates and locations. Cost is \$20. Clearances must be submitted on the day of training. Delay clearances will delay badging. Register online for one of these dates and locations.
